2023 Sermon Series

The Heart of Christmas offered a theology of the incarnation through the lens of Matthew 11:28-30.











For the first time in Friedens' history, we had believer's baptisms in the sanctuary during services.

In 2023, we continued our focus on intentionally **studying the Bible** for ourselves.



"Digging into Scripture" has been a wonderful class for me this past year. I enjoyed reading Bible passages section by section – taking time to identify, reflect, and discuss with others what we had read. I am thankful that I have been able to

learn techniques for analyzing and enjoying Scripture with such a thoughtful group of congregants. Because I took the class with my husband, we have had regular conversations that enriched our spiritual relationship with each other. I can't wait to continue developing this useful and lifelong skill of reading through Scripture! -Kim Olsen

In April, a man from out-of-state visited Friedens; he has extensive experience as a church leader but was deeply hurt by church, which damaged his faith and drove him from church. After his visit, he wrote: "Dear Brandon et al, Many thanks for your warm welcome today. This visit served to restore an important part of my gradually reconnecting faith. I am eternally grateful and hope to be able to worship with you again at some point." He wrote again in December to express his gratitude for Friedens' ministry, saying, "I am with you online just about every Sunday." We never know when or how God is going to impact someone's life through Friedens' ministry!



Worship Services provided a valuable way to gather with others in worshiping God, learning, and being inspired to follow Jesus. Each week, the Worship Team led us in singing praises to God, and the children's message engaged young people (and adults) with the sermon's topic. Memorable moments from 2023 include: Student Sunday, when middle and high schoolers led almost every part of

the service, including ushering &



food; a fantastic **Christmas drama** called "The Innkeeper's Dilemma;" testimonies; and missionaries giving updates on their ministries. In addition, the **Good Friday Experience** moved participants through 7 stations that followed Jesus from the Garden to the Grave.



Children's & Student Ministries

Sunday School classes began at age 3. The **4K-8th grade** classes continued the multiyear cycle of walking through the Bible using Gospel Story curriculum. In this age range, 40 children attended at least twothirds of the Sunday school classes! Their commitment is building a great foundation for their faith! The **High School** class studied Acts & Romans and memorized passages from Romans that help them internalize and articulate the gospel.

Motion Midweek Ministry grew by 18% to an average weekly attendance of 33 students. In January, 31 students attended the Districts Youth Conference.

Sunday Adult Classes equipped participants with biblical teaching, such as the book of Revelation, and practical skills, such as studying Scripture and handling conflict.

Adult Ministries

Adult Small Groups continue to play a key role in building disciple-making relationships at Friedens. Eight groups met during 2023 to study the Bible, pray, and share life together.


Men's Ministry hosted fundraisers, breakfasts, and a No Regrets conference site at Friedens.

We hosted a **church picnic** & cornhole tournament. We had our first **Pickleball, Pool, and Pizza Party!** We hosted four **Movie & Game Nights**, including one outdoors with a bonfire. We contin-

ued enjoying food in Fellowship Hall after every worship service. People connected at life-stage-based potlucks, the Easter Breakfast, Thanksgiving Praise & Pie, and the caroling potluck.

A Story of Serving

One of Friedens' priorities is equipping the church family to be missionaries in our spheres of influence. Through our **Local Needs** ministry, Friedens helps individuals in practical ways, including helping people in crisis pay for gas, food, and utility bills. But there are countless under-the-radar ways that individuals from Friedens are making an impact in the community. One example is when Liz Luther put out an urgent request for help moving out of her duplex. **More than a dozen people from Friedens showed up within an hour!**



Here is an encouraging note from Tyler Holthaus of what he experienced while helping: While helping Liz Luther move out of her duplex and talking

with the landlord/owner of the property, the owner mentioned many times over an hour-long span how impressed and taken aback she was by how compassionate and helpful the Friedens congregation is. She was amazed by the selflessness and quickness of people giving up their time or changing what they were doing in order to come help a member of their church. This woman has been a life-long resident of Port Washington and said she had never seen such a thing. I mentioned that when we say "the Friedens Family." we mean it and it's just not a tag line; she said, "I guess not!" She wanted to go back to her church and see if they could set up something similar to how we at Friedens go about things like this. She kept making remarks throughout my time there about how impressed she is with our church.

Children's & Student Ministries

Of the 48 children who attended **iGnite** in the 2022-23 ministry year, 26 were not part of Friedens! Even more impressive is that 63% of iGnite's newcomers became regular attenders!

Students continue to love inviting friends to **Midweek**! 18 new students attended in 2023, 10 of whom came back regularly. Midweek also serves as a fruitful pathway for connecting students and their families with the broader church.



Our family began attending Friedens in August of 2023 and jumped right in! Dan and I became official members this fall and it's been wonderful. Our family already knew several Friedens families, so when we were looking for a church to join, it was easy to decide to try out Friedens.

Since we've been attending, mine and Dan's personal relationships to Jesus have grown exponentially; more importantly, so have our children's. Having a safe and comfortable environment for our kids to make friends and learn about and form their own relationships with Jesus is extremely important to us, and we've found that in Friedens. Joining Friedens has been a very welcoming experience for our family, and we're excited for what's to come!"

In September, we held our second **Neighborhood Party**. We rented a bounce house, set up games and the Kidja Warrior Course, painted faces, made balloon animals, hosted a cornhole tournament, and served free food – all in the church's parking lot! About 160 people attended – half of whom were from outside the church!





What Else Happened?

Fifty-two people from Friedens went **Christmas caroling**, bringing the joy of Christmas to residents and staff at five care facilities around Port Washington! Friedens ran two **GriefShare** groups; of the 9 participants, 7 were from outside the church! **The 40 Days of Prayer** mobilized the Friedens Family to pray for the salvation of hundreds of people in our spheres of influence.

Our perfinerships in the world

Children's Ministries raised money to buy 3 goats, 200 chicks, and one beehive kit for families in poverty through **The Heifer Project**.

Friedens' Women's Ministry created 48 "blessing bags" for **Portlight Homeless Shelter** and helped **Hidden Treasure Resale Shop** prepare for Christmas.

Friedens' staff and several Board members participated in a Dementia Friendly Business Training led by the **Aging & Disability Resource Center**; this was the first step of equipping Friedens to better minister to those impacted by dementia in the church and community.

Friedens hosted six **blood drives** in 2023, collecting 82 units of blood. These donations touch the lives of over 246 patients in local Wisconsin hospitals!

Friedens continued to be a collection site for the **Port Washington Food Pantry**. In addition to food and toiletries, we collected 54 cold-weather items in December.

In 2023, we continued our parntnership with Global Fingerprints (the EFCA's child sponsorship ministry). We are part-



nering with three sites in Nagpur, India, which serve around 400 children and their families. The sites provide tutoring, meals, medical care, and Bible teaching. There have been numerous baptisms, a church planted, and multiple churches growing because of the impact of the Global Fingerprints sites.




What else happened in 2023?

Friedens' facilities are an important resource in our ministry. In 2023, extensive repair work was done on the brick of the church's east side. The north parking lot was resurfaced. CG Schmidt replaced the west exterior stairs for free since the concrete was failing prematurely. The DNR finally completed its case for the remediation of contaminated soil that was discovered during the 2019 building project. And a chil-





In 2019-2020, Friedens' building was transformed by a major renovation and addition. We are making tremendous progress in paying off the loan! When the loan is retired, it will free up \$80,400/year in the operating budget.

Key Financial Trends

CONGREGATIONAL GIVING

Contributions by the church family increased 6.9% from the prior fiscal year. The 2022-2023 fiscal year marked the highest-ever level of congregational giving at Friedens!

EXPENSES

Spending tracked very close to the budgeted amount (0.8% over budget). However, this represented an 8% increase in expenses from the previous fiscal year. The increase was due to inflation in most line items and maintenance of Friedens' building (including doubling the amount we set aside in capital reserves).

MISSIONS GIVING

Isn't it wonderful that Friedens' third highest "expense" was investing in ministry beyond the church walls?!

GIVING RANGES

The percentage of contributors in each range remained similar from 2022. The total number of households dropped by 5%, but there was a 4% increase in contributors in the \$4000+ range.
